How can the NNE-PTN help?

Participating Practices receive these benefits:

- A baseline assessment of your readiness to succeed in today's health care environment, conducted by PTN staff in partnership with participating practices
- Create a specific plan addressing the needs of your practice, with a focus on identifying areas for improving
 patient care, practice team functioning, and the financial health of your practice
- Access to PQRS Solutions, a CMS-approved Physician Quality Reporting System (PQRS) vendor, offered at no
 cost to your practice (Hurry, if you sign up now, there may still be time to submit PQRS data for 2015 and avoid
 penalties in 2017).
- Build practice systems to capture significant revenue dollars from underused CMS payment opportunities, such as the Medicare Annual Wellness Exam, Transitional Care Management, Chronic Care Management, and Advanced Care Planning codes.
- Understand and maximize current CMS payment incentives (and avoid future penalties), complying with the CMS Value Modifier and Merit Based Payment System (MIPS)
- Access a range of in-person and web-based quality improvement educational support and tools, including teambased care (e.g., TeamSTEPPS), patient self-management, and community resources tools
- Network with and learn from other primary care, specialist, and behavioral health practices and clinicians in your community
- Earn Continuing Medical Education (CME) and Part IV Maintenance of Certification (MOC) credit for participating in PTN learning activities





What is the NNE-PTN?

The Northern New England Practice Transformation Network is a collaborative effort of trusted organizations in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont directly supporting clinicians and practices to achieve the "Triple Aim" of better health outcomes, better patient care, and decreased care costs.

NNE-PTN lead organizations are Maine Quality Counts (QC), the New Hampshire Citizens Health Initiative (NHCHI), and the Vermont Program for Quality in Healthcare (VPQHC)—all locally based with a unique understanding of the issues facing the region's clinicians and practices.

The NNE-PTN is funded by the **Centers for Medicare and Medicaid** (CMS) to support and accelerate the pace of practice change and position practices for valuebased payment models.

How do I join the NNE-PTN? Are there requirements?

Your engagement and participation is all that's required. Practices that join agree to:

- Identify two key contacts per practice to lead improvement efforts (clinical lead and administrative leader)
- Participate in a baseline practice assessment with PTN staff.
- Work with PTN staff to develop practice goals and strategies, based on assessment findings
- Participate in NNE-PTN learning activities, including PTN meetings, webinars and related educational events.
- Work with PTN staff to develop a system for reporting selected process and outcome measures on a quarterly basis
- Participate in only one Practice Transformation Network (PTN)

What results can I expect?

Participating practices will get help to successfully implement existing Medicare payments. The following is an estimate of what a practice could gain:
