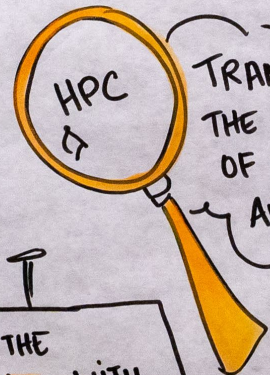

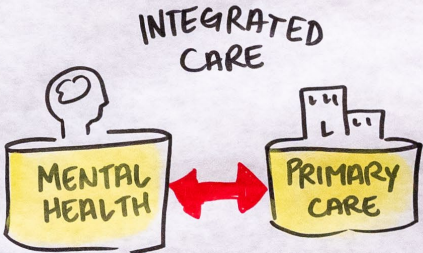

Empowering an entity to consistently collect and publicly report understandable healthcare cost, use, quality and equity trends in NH's healthcare system	26.14%	40
Shifting healthcare spending to primary care and mental health without increasing overall healthcare budgets	22.22%	34
Developing an office of health consumer advocacy and information	18.30%	28
Creating an entity to engage stakeholders to set healthcare strategy	16.99%	26
Setting and measuring a statewide healthcare spending target	16.34%	25
